Meshack starts into the wild weeknights we used to put in when we were rollin' in my raggedyred, tonka-toy pick-up, going to clubs to put in work. Ol' Dirty Bastard dropped solo and Kronick got one of the most colorful Innerviews to date. Gza got his in the Two-Year Anniversary issue as we spoke from his cellphone while driving on the streets of Manhattan. But all that was not enough. We here at Kronick went RUGGED & RAW... Head-up with the Shaolin Soldiers on the Frontline of WAR: Geared with Fatt Sacks, cameras loaded with extra rounds, Brothas SUITED, BOOTED & ZOOTED!!! Alas, we bring the Complete Book of WU; chapter by chapter.

I can't get no sleep because I'm excited. Excited that this Issue is here. Just like the Wu always do what has never been done before, so does the Kronick. Shit like this was put into motion before the Beginning of Time for this Moment. And it's our pleasure





We spot Raekwon in the Director's chair fixed to the monitor while various local Liggers (read: Jolly Ranchers a.k.a. Loser Niggas') stand around only to be ignored. Rae's attention is on the staged verse of Masta Killah who appears towering above the imaginary crowd. Our Contact tells us that other members are in the area, but after a thorough Search and Reconnaisance effort, Wiggles & I are out til man~ana.

4:00 P.M. WU Day 1- As soon as we drive up, security is on us like a cheap suit, but they're cordial. After encouraging Loupy, Wiggles & I to go to the media `tent' between the two sound stages and wait for our contact, we sit in the ride and blaze one just to loosen up the vibes. Rollin' three deep can be too visible when strapped with cameras and shit so we case the area of strategic importance and gravitate.

4:25 P.M. WU Day 1- Spotting Cappadonna in the center of a cipher (another local Jolly Rancher Weeny Roasting) we make our move conspicuously handing him a Kronick in full sight of a pack of blunts. Once Donn realizes who we are, he sidesteps the circumference and establishes the initial contact bringing us into the WU Cipher. Before we can chop Game, a set crew member swiftly intercepts our moves and we have to wait and see.

4:55 P.M. WU Day 1- After politickin' with Promotions man Cash over some La-La to get on the set, we spot Masta Killah on his way to the main stage. After speaking with him, it wasn't long before our contact from Fine Sistahs came looking for us. She pulled us onto the set and here's where the fun begins... Our contact has us wait in a room and tells us she's sending in the first member she can grab. A few moments later, I impatiently go see where she disappeared to in the sea of crew, press, and extras making my way to the dressing Room. There she is at the door looking stressed when out from the shadows pops U-God with what's left of a Blunt in hand. he says he'll be right out as soon as he's done 'Steaming'. A few moments later he emerges to take the pole position as Point Man.

KRONICK: So um, this next issue is gonna be a Wu Exclusive-type shot where I do individuals. So we get the Blessing of going with you first. Brotha U-God, one of my first questions would be in the midst of the Wu Empire hittin' hard for the last three or four years and a lotta solo albums comin out: When will the U-God album be comin' out?

U-GOD: Well, I'ma start workin' on my shit right after we finished oin' all this buncha Press; This Tourin'. Like in between time. I'm like this on the Daily. U-GOD: They call me the Ralph-Mouth, the Grouch in ya House. You ain't really see my side. See, People don't know: I don't be playin'. That's why I'm so quiet. It's just, I be on the Down-Low. Me & Masta Killah are like two of the quietest members. So We just be on the Low. And keep it Movin'

KRONICK: But then, like one of the most memorable verses off the first Wu album comes from The Mystery Of Chessboxin'; your verse. You know, the way you come Strong! And then it seemed like, you don't hear from a Brotha for awhile throughout the process of the other albums.

U-GOD: Yea.

KRONICK: And then um, like we'll see you in the Riddler Video

or somethin'.

U-GOD: See, you ain't hear Black Jesus on Starks album? You ain't hear me on Who's The Knucklehead on Rae's album. Cause people probably did'nt even know who was on there; there was so many Niggaz on there. Um, Menace To Society, um Winter

KRONICK: Right!

U-GOD: People did'nt even know that was Me that set it off.

KRONICK: We Are The Champions?

U-GOD: Champions: Me & Cappa Donna. If It's Alright With You... It's like, certain things... It's like, We threw out so much Shit, it's that I don't Understand: some people don't grasp it until you do your solo Shit. Then they gonna be like, `Oh, these are all the shits that he did'. Then they wanna do a collective of all your shit. But you know, I get Busy, Man. I Gets Busy. KRONICK: So what's the part in the Video, if you could describe t, when they show your verse?

U-GOD: I don't even know right about now, Man. I'm Fuckin' Heated right now. I don't know what's gonna happen with my verse right about now, Man! I'ma just have ta just come with Poise. I just have ta freak it on some Camera Shit: some funny Camera-Trick Shit! I'ma just have ta put the Charisma in it. You know, I don't really know! First I was supposed to be hangin' upside-down. You know? I DON'T KNOW!! There's so much Shit! comes out the Illest, we gonna put it on the TV out there for ya. KRONICK: Alright. Another question would be about the A.K.A.'s. Yours is Lucky Hands?

U-GOD: I got Lucky Hands, Baby U, Golden-Eye, Golden Arms. Um... Goldstein, Ralph-Mouth Grouch.

KRONICK: Goldstein? What's Goldstein?

U-GOD: That's A.K.A.'s! Ain't that the question?

KRONICK: What do they call you that for?
U-GOD: They call me a Jew. That's my Jew name. (We all start laughing) You know I save some Cheese, Boy. I'll stack some Cheddar FAST!!

KRONICK: I'ma ask all the members this question. When y'all first came out, as a group and as individuals, y'all did what was thought to be impossible. Now the Second Coming... U-GOD: Oh, with the Second Coming everybody in the world done copied our shit now. So now it's like whatever, whatever. Right now We just gonna Show & Prove that We CAN RHYME OUR MUTHA JUCKIN ASSES OFF!!!

KRONICK: Twice as strong: double-disc...
U-GOD: Yes, Powerful! It's Heavy. It's REAL HEAVY. It's like, the first CD is Heavy. And Then the second CD is HEAVY. It ain't like, DAMN! You might just need to just... Turn the Shit off cause there's so much Fuckin' Rhymes!

KRONICK: Y'all got the CD-Rom thang goin' on with it too, right?

U-GOD: Yea, we got the CD-Rom. KRONICK: What's that all about?

U-GOD: Yea, you type in people's names and you get to go into they Chambers. How they really bugg out. If you touch my Shit, you'll see Ralph-Mouth! Grough in your Muthafuckin' House!! KRONICK: When you page someone and leave a code at the end, what is the number that you leave?

U-GOD: For my pager code sometimes 49311.


KRONICK: What does that mean?


U-GOD: My Dick, Nigga!!
KRONICK: (We all get a good laugh out of that one!) I know where 49311 comes from. Cappa Donna said it in Winter Warz. U-GOD: ...777, 007, um, umm. What? 888-Build, build. Everybody got their little tricks.

KRONICK: So that's about it Bro unless there's anything you

wanna build upon.

U-GOD: I ain't got nothin' to say. All I got to say is , Man I got to Show & Prove to the World, Man. That's it, man! I ain't got nothin' to say. MC's ain't got nothin' to say!





CAPPA: Yea, yea, yea, what's Up! Vain-Glorious Kid, Dark City Parade! It's Cappa Donna a.k.a. Cappachino The Great from the Tri-State!!

KRONICK: [Wiggles gets a little upset and starts up at me about our location] I thought you said we could go outside though... CAPPA: Here for the Second Coming. You know how We do! KRONICK: [Looking at P like, 'Why now?'] We're goin' ahead and choppin' it up right now, so let's shoot the flicks afterwards. Um, there's a famous line you say, and it's even in your verse on Triumph. `When you hear your voice on the song', how's it go?
CAPPA: It's on this song? It's on the song?

KRONICK: I'm sayin'. The line that you say is, 'When you hear

your voice...'
CAPPA: "You heard other Raps before, but kept waitin' for the Sun of Psalm/ I keep Dance Hall strong". Right there, that's my intro. You naw amean? Strait Up!

KRONICK: The biggest question that's probably on the Minds of the Readers who are gonna check for this Innerview is, out of which Chamber did Cappa Donna come? Because on the first album we did'nt hear or see the Voice. But now, I think from Ice Cream it's been an onslaught that has'nt stopped and won't stop

CAPPA: It was Ice Cream. KRONICK: On Rae's album?

CAPPA: No doubt. That was like the third solo album right there.

So I coming from Chamber Three. Strait up. The first Branch, the third leaf. You naw amean?

KRONICK: Can you step outside and burn this? (blunt I just finished rolling)

CAPPA: Yea, we can do that anywhere you wanna do it! In here, out there!

KRONICK: Yea, let's take it outside in the Sun so we can take some flicks. (So we make our way to the now vacant 'Media tent' outside between the two sound stages) Alright so where I was at, was sayin' that from that Rae album: it seems like cut after cut we're seein' and hearin' the Voice on song after song. But how did that lead to the appearin' on the Ghostface album? CAPPA: Oh, cause Ghostface album right there, was the next album comin'. And that's was like, the Iron Chamber right there. So I was dealin' with that element, you know? Bein' that I was a newcomer fulla Iron and everything like that, you know?! Iron, calcium and all that. But that's where I had to make my second mark right there. I had to do that. That was meant to be, you know? Everything right now is just going accordin' to plans. It's hard to really trace back to where, how we came amongst these Chambers right here. Because it's been going on ever since we came from the womb. We been carryin' out our duty like that. When we come together, it just makes everything coincide. And me, Rae & Ghost coincide the most, cause we have Chamber similarities to us. It's like we have the Witty Unpredictable Cuban Link Slang. You know, that's how we came about with those

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KRONICK: Totally Original and created by you Brothas.

CAPPA: No doubt.

KRONICK: There was nobody who was talkin' about that before you Brothas brought it out and put it on wax. Um, the Second Coming: a double disc. Where the first album and all the solo joints did what was befere considered impossible; now it's happenin' all over again twice as nice. What are your thoughts and views on the Second Coming: Wu-Tang Forever? And your input?

CAPPA: From the outside lookin' in: I see it like... I see it like a Temple; a Temple that's bein' rebuilt, reconstructed. And bringin forth more of an Understandin' of what We dealin' with, you know.

KRONICK: Alright.

CAPPA: So from the outside lookin' in, you're acceptin' towards our Stand: and what We stand for. And what We Stand For is


Proper Education Allah Cee Eternal.

KRONICK: Alright. Um, One of the comparisons that I draw to the Wu from the ancient times is, like Pyramid Builders because there's so many Brothas. And it's like, you build block upon block with a very large Foundation being the whole Wu-Tang itself. What is it like for everyone to come together to put a Wu album down? Cause I've had it told to me from other people at Record Companies: whenever there's an individual Wu album, it's just like a whole Family effort, still.

CAPPA: That goes two ways, you know. Because when you got a solo artist goin' ahead and doin' his thing; swingin' his axe the way he need to do it, you gotta go ahead and give him room. But at the same time, you gotta be there to help him catch that tree when it falls. You know, you gotta put that battery in his back that's gonna go ahead and greater his influence to wanna go ahead and achieve his goal. And his goal is to go ahead and finish that album, and make it sound crisp and clear. And that's

KRONICK: Alright. It's been said that the Wu Enterprise or the Wu Conglomerate is like an octopus; it reaches out with many tentacles. What are some of your outside interests within the Wu Camp besides the obvious: bein' on the microphone?

CAPPA: Besides bein' on the microphone? Me, I'm just kind of like... I'ma Seeker. I wanna be there, noticed: but unnoticed. You know, I wanna be accepted: and Loved. And I wanna return that in a greater aspect thru my Knowledge, Wisdom, & Understanding. The best thing I love to do, is to do for other people. Man, that's what makes my light shine Bright. Brighter and Brighter, when I could just be doin' for people, Man. But not bein' a part of that Jealousy, Envy, Hatred, and Greed society. Word, that's what admires me, Man.

KRONICK: You know when you page someone, do you ever

leave like a code to let them know that it's you?

CAPPA: Yea, I be leavin' a code.

KRONICK: Can you tell me what that might be?

CAPPA: I be leavin' the Triple-7.

KRONICK: And what does that stand for?
CAPPA: The Triple-7 is just 21. That's how many ciphers right

there surround the Earth.

KRONICK: Alright. And then one of my final questions would be, as far a the Wu-Tang Forever: Second Coming album. What Jewels are you droppin' for people? What can they check for when they hear that Voice again on the Song? And then likewise, what can people look for from the Cappa Donna solo album that's soon to come?

CAPPA: When they hear my Voice on the Song, they can definitley be lookin' forward to some continuous usage of Words. All flowin' for one cause. And that's to bring that special ending. To bring everything that has a beginning has an ending to it except Knowledge. Anything like this that's physical, it won't last long. But Knowledge lasts forever, so my flow is gonna forever go ahead and just keep splashin' at you, and splashin' at you

regardless. Even if it's a suckie rhyme or whatever, Man. Because the best Knower is me; because I got control of those Thoughts right there. And certain things that I kick out there: it's not for everybody. So whoever don't like any kinda dart that I throw out... It's like that right there is what they don't specialize in, you know? Let somebody else who did'nt get a turn go ahead and grab that right there. And you just stop bein' so concieted.

KRONICK: Yea, one of my favoritest verses of yours is on that song. I don't know the title is... It's like Fully-Automatic-Rap-Assassin or somethin' like that? It's off one of the Soundtracks. And the way you end the song, you just keep rhymin' and rhymin'

and rhymin' until the last beat!

CAPPÁ: You talkin' about Winter Warz, My Brova!! It's like I swung that bat right there straight around. Cause it's like bases was loaded and I had to go ahead and bring those people in, Man. Cause that had to happen right there. As soon as I went in, I spit that out right there. It was nt no problem. And yo man, that's what happens man, when just go ahead and speak from the heart man. You make beautiful noise continuously.

KRONICK: Alright. Uh, one of my final questions would be to comment on the production style of RZA. And how he's able to Master each artist or each Individual from the Wu's personality. His sound is crafted such that it brings out the best in each artist. CAPPA: The Abbott is very special with his talent. It's like he sleeps with sound and within his sleep his thoughts be travellin' right there. So it's like, he could punch in cause he's got a computer-type Mind. He can punch into your wavelength; what kind of energy your body's givin' off. He absorbs that because he's on a quest for sound. And at the same time, he's an intelligent poetry writer because sound brings about vibration. And he's able to tap into that. He can either tap into that and bring about a beat, or tap into it and bring about a treat! Somethin' that everybody can go ahead and learn from.

KRONICK: Alright. Can we take some pictures of your Gold Medallion in the light. Can you speak upon what the image is? CAPPA: The image right there, that's the Virgin Mary right there. You know? And the grass (the green Emerald stone below her image), that's the grass right there that we live on. That's the vegetables...that's the food right there. And the Gold (a solid 6inch Medallion held around his neck by a Cuban Link chain) is the Gold that they stole from us.

KRONICK: The Jewels are Magnificent, Brotha!

CAPPA: Thanks. And the red right there (the Ruby stone above her head) is the blood that we shed in the struggle, Man!





5:50 P.M. Wu Day 1- Here's where shit starts to get tricky. Everyone is getting ready for the group scene in the video. The Dressing Room is housing something like 20 niggaz when there's only 10 in the group. Clothes are EVERYWHERE yet each member meticulously and deliberately add their own particular touch to their gear. The only thing that they have in common is the color Black as the uniform. Seeing Masta Killa as one that had been both friendly and familiar with in the past, I signaled for him to come speak into the mic. He informed me that he wasn't feeling up to no interviews, but that he would grant Kronick a few words on the strength from THE SILENT OBSERVER KRONICK: Alright, we'll start this off like so: Masta Killa. One of the Wu members I had the honor of meeting some time ago. We had a chance then to kick-it and Vibe together an whatnot. So one of the first questions I had wanted to ask was, what can people look for in store for the Masta Killa Solo Project if there is one?

MASTA KILLA: (A bit pensive) You can just look forward to what they normally look for in Me. They ain't gonna be really too much different. It's just gonna be straight to the bone. I'm just state the point. Keep it basic; keep it simple: keep it Hip Hop. KRONICK: Right.





KRONICK: (Just after U-God, Meth & Inspectah Deck step away from the lights & cameras of MTV) So yo Man, We got this special Wu Issue of the Kronick.

METH: Gimme one of those! We been lookin' for these! KRONICK: (to Deck) We're doin' the Great Individuals. (Allofasudden, Meth & U-God start admiring the back issues) That's the Old School one with you on the cover Meth!

METH: That's kinda slick right here!

KRONICK: (Handing 'em an Erykah Badu Issue) This is the new joint though. (They all get quiet) And the next joint is y'all's joint (We wait for some type of response as they all study the Badu

METH: Yea! (sharing his Cover Issue with U-God) Hey look at this!

KRONICK: (As Loupy goes in one direction with Meth & U-God, Me & P take a walk toward the skyscrapers with the Rebel INS) Like I was sayin', we're doin' a Whole Wu Issue, Man. And I wanted to get everyone's individual perspective. I would like to start out by sayin' that before you guys put your first joint out, you did what was considered impossible before. And that was to come 9-Deep successfully, and then branch off into solo albums. So uh, the question that everyone's askin' is when is the Rebel INS solo joint?

INS: Rebel INS: you can quote "Rebel INS just signed his Joint".

I'ma be dealin' with LOUD Records to keep it in the Fam. It's like they, They, THEY makin' loot so we gotta dig back in the pockets, you know what I been sayin'? Wu Day 1: Leaving the additional soundstage where MTV & the NYC mini-skyskrapers are, we return to the main-stage where everyone is in their own ciphers inhaling all the flavors of the Gods. Raekwon is juggling the crew who is setting up on the second stage, the celebration for Ghost & Papa Wu on the Main Stage, and the assortment of Video & Magazine Crews [Us included] pulling him in every direction. By now, the mushrooms are starting to kick in and everyone who partook is beginning to open up and express themselves both quietly and loudly. 

RZA: (Smiling) Yea, is that what they say?

KRONICK: You put in a lot of work on every single project that comes out and it seems as though the work is crafted to best suit the artist's personality. What goes into making an album for all the different individuals in the WU?

RZA: It's like, it's like, as far as me bein' the hardest working man in Hip Hop; work ain't never hard! It's like a bee: a bee enjoys its work all day pollinatin' the world and making honey as a result. Honey comes from a bee's throw-up. RZA: Naw, we didn't come out for that. We didn't come out for that at all!! We came out for Hip Hop wherever it's located at. I'm just here to let you know that right now Rap is out. There's a difference! I don't care what they dol! I could've made an album with a whole bunch of songs, and just went and sold 20 million records based on the popularity of the group and the popularity of the song I took or recovered over. We creatin' from our Hearts. KRONICK: What's the concept on the new album with this Single whereby it's mentioned, 'Ok we gonna go back further to '79', instead of '89?

RZA: Yea, cause everything is reverse, well, when the Old Dirt says let's take it back to `79, he's goin' back to our childhood.

KRONICK: Ok.

RZA: Because you was the most innocent and the most truthfulness at your childhood. Because the world is new to you. It's a Triumph to become a Man, it's a TRIUMPH for you to become a Man, and then return back to a child. You gonna turn back to a child Regardless: even as you get old your body will decay back down. And like you couldn't Shit for yourself and wipe your own ass, and piss as a child; all that's gonna return back unto you anyway. But We Triumphin' right now, and We standin' up as Men. But realizin our childhood and recognizin' it. Like the song tells you on Ghostface; like it's Wu-Tang is a never-ending Saga. You can't are one song from there, and then you go start from there. That's like reading Revelations first before you read the Bible. You may get all that right there and get shocked, but you gotta read the Book

KRONICK: ...Yeal When the solo joints started goin' off and the deals were bein' made, certain individuals were sayin', "Well, it's gonna play itself out". And it did'nt!! Again you proved 'em wrong! The first time you proved 'em wrong with 9-members deep bein' successful. The second time you proved 'em wrong over and over with the solo joints. Now it's the Second Coming: Wu-Tang Forever Killer Bee Style

KRONICK: ...It was before it's time the first time around. RZA: Yea!.


KRONICK: This time out everybody's like, mouth-watering. RZA: Right.

RZA: Yea!! (Smiling) It was like, it was like, it was like, that, that, That was like more of a childhood dream right that, that, that was like more a character of the third there. See, thru Music & Entertainment you got a chance to actually Live out your Mind and your Imagination. It's still Artistic. KRONICK: Right.

RZA: Then when Videos came, how somebody looked was the big thing no matter what they said. Now you could sell your look as hooks. So I came with the Visual of that right there, and a fat beat, and a fat message with fat lyrics. That's how Triumph is. That's how the whole thing is, Man. It's like, this year you'll see every angle covered. I think we had lacked in the visuals sometimes, because we didn't really care about the Visual as much as we see that the TV will Tell-Lies-Via-Vision. Tell-lievision. Se we always try to show the streets and the Realness of it, an shit. But sometimes it's good to Entertain the eyes; make the cake look good.

RONICK: Right, right! That nice icing.

RZA: That's how We movin' right now. But the whole difference between us is that we makin' that vegetable platter look as good. We got gravy on that vegetable platter. You ever have a vegetable platter with rice & gravy? That shit taste like it got steak somewhere in there. And We gotta do that cause they just not eatin' the vegetables like that.

KRONICK: For the most part, the fans of the Wu know RZA as

the man who speaks thru the beats. Right?


RZA: Right.

KRONICK: From the Genius album.

RZA: Yea, I do my thang, an shit. I hang out. You know, like I been in the streets. '87 I was a...you know in '87 when the Polo and Tommy Hill was poppin? I brought that to Shaolin. Me & Ol' Dirty was about the two Flyest Niggaz you would know. We always stayed Fly & Dipped. Jewelry hangin', younowhatImean? But I grew out of that though. So Bobby Steeles reflects back on that. RZA: You got Sunz Of Man. You got Killa Army. Then you got the Grave Diggaz... Um, The Wu Elements is the name of my Producers. That's Inspectah Deck, Mathematix, 4th Disciple, True Masta, Goldfinger, Mo' Betta, Myself; We are the Wu Elements. We produced the Sunz Of Man album. Um, um the Grave Diggaz album was produced by Wu Elements. Um, um Killa Army is produced mostly by 4th Disciple. He's Hype, he's Hype! He's incredible. Then we got LA The Darkman. We got T'Kietha, Heart & Soul, 12 O'Clock. We got a lot of Singers now. We got Madd Shit! About 13 albums are gonna come out. And it's all gonna be all good Hip Hop though. So see how you were just flooded with all that other Bullshit? You about to be flooded with Hip Hop now.

KRONICK: Ok, the last question I wanna ask you Brotha, is... RZA: And it might not be on the Radio! This may be the Underground, Harriet Tubman movement. Nowhatlmean? KRONICK: The last question I wanted to ask you has to do with,





When the guys at Mototorola were first developing the Pager, I'm sure they didn't anticipate people using them for much more than leaving phone numbers. What they didn't know was that everyone from the common stick-up-kid to your gay brothers uncle were soon going to have pagers and that they would push the communicative capabilities of the pager to the limit. Nowadays, when I get hit on my box I have to check to make sure what it is. It could be a phone number or a set of mild mannered numbers disquised in "pager-talk". Pager-talk is a way to communicate messages over the pager with the use of numbers and dashes as a sort of language. The first form of pager talk was the pager code, which is a number son ature that's used like a name. The numbers usually have some sentimental reason for being (birthdays, cars, etc.). People would leave their code after punching in their phone number. This way the person recieving the page would know who it was that was raging them. Screening pages became more common and many people wouldn't call back pages if they didn't know who it was the association of certain obvious numbers to actions that would relate.
